Message from the Program Director

As of late January 2021, there are no set events scheduled for the spring due to COVID-19 restrictions, but I am open to any suggestions.

Our February 2021 guest speaker is the Captain/Owner of the *Oceanside 95*, Rick Slavkin. Rick earned his stripes via his lifelong career in the SoCal charter boat industry. He has worked as a deckhand, cook, commercial boat owner and the sport-fisher of the Seahawk LXV. He has been Captain of the *Oceanside 95* ("O-95") for the past seven years. For this past year, he has been the Owner/Operator of the O-95.

The O-95 is used for both inshore and offshore long-range fishing trips. This vessel has a very spacious platform and holds 125 scoops of bait. The boat also features refrigerated and brine fish holds. The vessel has a modern galley and is designed to sleep 49 persons in air-conditioned staterooms. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the O-95 is running with a maximum of 30 passengers on multi-day trips and a maximum of 36 passengers on ½ and ¾ day trips. The boat is presently undergoing routine boat maintenance, cosmetic repairs, and upgrades.

Of course, the 2021 budget has to be funded, and our traditional sources of income are temporarily closed due to the pandemic. So it's a "hope list" that we can't implement until the COVID-19 crisis is over, or more controlled.

<u>Anglers 4 Kids:</u> Fred Kaczmarek and John DeWitt will be applying for their annual grant from the San Diego County Fish and Wildlife Advisory Commission for partial financial support. Wayne Kotow, CCA - Calif. has offered to work with us should the Festival need new line or tackle. We've donated some used equipment to them in the past. About 150 kids attend, but they've only had 30 to 50 rods to share.

<u>Anglers 4 Military:</u> If COVID-19 restrictions continue, I'm sure Jim Mauritz will be on his fundraising bandwagon as he was last year. Through donations by members and supporter of the military, he was able to run two additional military trips in 2020.
