HEAD CHARTER MASTER'S REPORT

Hello fellow Anglers,

Well here it is December. It sure has been a hard year for fishing. Majority of our charters were cancelled due to weather, two due to boat issues and a few due to our Club not being able to fill the charters. However we did have some great charters on the ones that did make it out.

We had two that went out in November. The first one went out on November 9th for a 1.5 day. We did depart late due to the weather. I would rather start fishing late than not go out at all. We looked for tuna schools in the morning. We did find some. The first hook up the tuna pulled the hook. The same Angler about an hour later got the second hook up, that one he landed, besides my Blue fin those turned out to be the only ones landed for the day. Each weighed in over 45lbs. Jack pot went to one of our newest members, Steve Stump, congratulations Steve. An honorable mention goes out to Dan Carter our farmer for the day. Later in the day we did find a spot for rock fishing. We landed 85 bottom fish. All of good quality. White fish, Boccaccio, Vermilion, and other bottom fish. Everyone had a great time. We departed with 9 members and 5 quests, returned with 11 members and 3 guests. We must be doing something right. Our second charter for November departed on the 13th. This charter was aboard the Blue Horizon out of Oceanside Sea Center. Sandra O'Brien prepared a dinner for our early departure. Some delicious turkey enchiladas. Thank you Sandra. We headed out in hopes to find some tuna. We did get to the tuna spot at around midnight. Believe it or not, 11 out of 12 were up fishing. We had absolutely no luck at all. So after about 4 or 5 hours we set off to San Clemente Island. Our cook Bret started to serve breakfast, we started our deep water rock cod fishing. It didn't take long and fish were coming over the rail, of course this didn't go without any tangles. We ended up limiting out with Rock fish. Capt Jim made a move to an area where White fish and Sheephead were. We loaded up with White fish and Sheephead. We finished the day by bagging, limits of rockfish, 1 ling and 119 various other rockfish, 78 Whitefish and 28 Sheephead. Not bad if I say so myself. The jackpot went to a non-member with an 11lb Lingcod. We had an excellent dinner, steak and lobster, yes a full lobster tail for each of us. We departed with 8 members and 4 guests returned with 9 members and 3 guests. It seems that everyone had a great time. This was our first overnight aboard the Blue Horizon. We may have lost out in the beginning of the year for Rock fish, we sure are making it up now.

We do have a charter set to finish the 2023 year. It's set to go out on December 5th, this well be going out to the 60 miles bank, it's a 1.5 day. We depart on Tuesday the 5th somewhere around 6PM, return on Thursday the 7th around 6AM. Limited load of 14 Anglers, cost is \$482. There are still 4 open spots. 
